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# Kingdown School Provider Access Policy

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## **Introduction**

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing access of providers of post-14, post-16 and post-18 education and training to students in Years 8 to 13 at Kingdown School. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

## **Student entitlement**

Students are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options evenings, talks, group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

### **Premises and facilities**

The school will make the school halls, classrooms or private meeting rooms available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the school careers advisor.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature in the careers library, which is managed by the school careers advisor. The careers library is available to all students at lunch and break times.
